The two following motions were made to ensure spending authority was in the minutes as they were in the missing minutes.

Motion made and passed to set aside \$5,000.00 for the Christmas Project to be spent on sending families to Triple Play. Hunt/Frank

Motion made and passed to set aside \$2,000.00 for the Christmas Fund to be spent by the Chapter on families in dire need. Hunt/Kindley.

The following funds are for the Chapter Christmas Project which will be Chaired by Cassandra Rzepa. Lew Allert, Bob Hunt and Charles Till and the Auxiliary Commander will compromise the Chapter Christmas Committee.

Motion made and passed to add the \$1,000.00 donation from the Northwest Golfers for Warriors to the Chapter Christmas Project. Hunt/Overman.

Motion made and passed to set aside \$8,000.00 for the Christmas Project. Till/ Johnson

Motion made and passed to set aside the \$1,740.58 left in last years Christmas Project to be spent in this year's Christmas Project. Hunt/Overman

The Christmas project has three basic parts.

\$5,000 dollars is set aside under the Christmas Project for the purpose of sending up to 35 families and 100 children, as a family, on dates of their choosing, for an all-expense paid day, with food and drinks provided also. Past experience has shown that depending on the number of families who sign up and the current cost, we can expect to have some money left over. It is intended that the left over money can be added to the fund for buying presents, food, candy, etc.

The \$2,000 fund is for families and veterans that the Chapter finds needing assistance that may or may not include Christmas presents. We have done everything from fixing roofs, replacing heating systems, replacing washers and dryers, etc. This fund is administered by the Chapter Commander with advice from Charles Till, Bob Hunt and anyone else who discovers a need.

At the moment the Christmas Project with Lew Allert and Cassandra Rezpa as the primary points of contact, with Charles Till and Bob Hunt in support have the following amount of money to spend.

Dave Mandel had a list of schools needing veterans to show up for school veterans day activities. He made the point that we need to support the youngsters.

Arnie Howe passed around the Golden Corral sign-up sheet. He needs help and can't do it all himself. November 11<sup>th</sup> is the last day and the free meal. The whole Chapter is needed there that day to help with the crowd.

Arnie Howe passed around the Convention ads samples and even though the convention is in the spring it requires a long time frame planning effort.

Lew Allert said the Toys for Tot Program is being run by National Level Toys for Tots, but still can use help.

Rathdrum will have a full day of Veterans Recognition Program at the High School on 9 November. Our own Charles Till will be honored as the 2019 Distinguished Veteran at 11 am. Lunch will be served.

Veterans Day on Monday the 11<sup>th</sup> will see Jerene Kindly presenting at least at America Legion Post 143 in Post Falls and this will take place at 1400. The Post will have open house all day.

CBOC Liaison Dennis Sinning has invited CDA CBOC Nurse Manager Brenda Baker for a presentation on her facility and a question and answer session at our next meeting.

A spirited discussion of the many difficulties members have encountered with the Mission Act.

The Commander appointed Dennis Sinning to collect three or four factual stories and boil them down to facts without emotion. The adjutant will then work up a letter to our Congressional Delegation with concrete examples of what the problems are in Idaho.
