#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

- A. National Order of Trench Rats is starting up with members from around the state. Cdr sent in 8 completed applications with checks because of concerns over the checks aging. National OTR processed the checks and issued ID's with instructions not to issue until initiation had been completed. Three additional applications are in hand and one transfer in for a total of 12 of 15 needed.
- B. Christmas wrapping is December 20<sup>th</sup> at St. George's starting at 1400. It is on a Sunday this year due to building availability. All hands will be needed to muster at Cdr's quarters to transport 150 boxes to church at 1230.

This money will allow up to 20 veterans to have a meal at dockside and the money is in addition to the Christmas Program project.

#### Motion made and Carried to donate \$1,000 to the North Idaho Standdown. McLean/Bacon

Motion made and carried to pay up to \$3,250 for the new heating and cooling system for Ray and Jan Almeida. Kirk/Waddell

Ray and Jan Almeida 208-561-5094 17274 Straight Arrow Trail

Ray Almeida is a Korean era service connected veteran (U.S. Air Force 1954 thru 1958) living with his wife in a 46 year old single wide trailer on a lot next to the Bayview Naval Base.

This trailer is maintained in a excellent manner and has the original electric Colman heating system. This heater has exceeded its lifetime, is very expensive to run and needs to be supplemented with a propane heater in the living room. The Coleman Heater is no longer available for direct replacement and without major upgrades, code requirements cannot be met.

This veteran was referred to Chapter 9 by Scott Thorsness, Kootenai County Veterans Service Officer.

During a site review and visit with the veteran the following was observed:

- The trailer was in excellent condition and has many years of service left
- Natural Gas is possible from Avista in the future (not to property at this time) but still involves major code required improvements for a gas system conversion in any older trailer.
- The best bid for an R&R in October 2014 was \$3000 and did not appear to meet the veterans needs and all code requirements
- Charlie Till, Chapter 9 and Dave Brostrom of Border Sheet Metal & Heating (Since 1942) found during the inspection the best possible solution appeared to be a heat pump, which solved installlation and building code issues.
- A high effincency heat pump also provides low cost operation along with air condioning which is currently provided by two very old window units
- The veteran and his wife both have serious health problems. He has a cancer, along with hearing
  problems and she has very expensive med copays that deplete thier meger income. Both are
  negatively affected by cold in the winter and high heat in the summer.
- After Dave Brostrom met with Lea Ann and Greg Brovillard (owners), working with Lennox Corp are able to install a high effincency Lennox system for \$3650 at the Almeida home.
- The veteran has been able to save a total of \$1500, leaving a Balance of \$2150, which I recommend we fund from Chapter 9 monies

 Border is a local company who supports local veterans, I belive after Dave's inspection and report that they have discounted this project by as much as 50%

The Almeida Service Officer is a near perfect execution of the Chapter's desire for an investigation by a service officer, a gathering of facts and a recommendation of a course of action with accompanying documentation

The total project cost is \$3,650 and last minute information showed that due to a hip replacement, expensive medication, physical therapy, the Almeida's plan to have saved \$500 per month by March for a total of \$1,500 would not be probable. The Chapter discussion determined that they needed heat now. Newby Ginnings donated \$200 to the Chapter and the Auxiliary voted to add \$500, leaving a \$300 surplus which is available to cover cost overruns.

50/50 was won by the Commander. He donated his winnings back to the Chapter for donation to the state.

Motion made and carried to give up to \$500 to Randall and Brittany Dowell in Blanchard for such purposes as utilities, gasoline, insurance, etc. The donation will be administered by Trudy and Ralph Shrigley.

Ralph has been the main mover in getting more wood to the Dowells and getting it cut and stacked.

Motion made and carried to set aside up to \$1,000 for Lorie Bunes and her ongoing electrical wiring project. Waddell/Overman

The Bunes home was built in three or more increments. The electrical panel is 60 amps and should be 200 amps. The entire house goes dark when the hot water heater comes on. The first electrician just gave a verbal estimate of \$6,000. At the last meeting, Bernie Fox said he had a friend that would do an estimate. The electrician did not appear. At this meeting it was determined that we had been asked for help over 80 days ago and we were nowhere. We obviously will not and cannot come up with \$6,000. The Chapter needs to see a written estimate, a detailed estimate and one that might break down the work into priorities. Part of the \$1,000 can be used for an estimate if need. Don Waddell will see if he can get an electrician to do an estimate.
